SELF-EXAMINATION OF BUDGET RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-78b has authorized the Local Finance Board to adopt rules that permit municipalities in sound fiscal condition to assume the responsibility, normally granted to the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, of conducting the annual budget examination; and

WHEREAS, N.J.A.C. 5:30-7 was adopted by the Local Finance Board on February 11, 1997; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 5:30-7.2 through 7.5, the Borough of Glen Rock has been declared eligible to participate in the program by the Division of Local government Services, and the Chief Financial officer has determined that the local government meets the necessary conditions to participate in the program for the 2013 budget year.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the governing body of the Borough of Glen Rock that in accordance with N.J.A.C. 5:30-7.6a & 7.6b and based upon the Chief Financial Officer's certification, the governing body has found the budget has met the following requirements:

¹ Subject to the right of the Borough of Glen Rock to extend the Pool Concession Agreement for the period of two (2) years (2015 and 2016 pool seasons) at a fixed cost of ten (10%) percent per year increase in the 2014 contract award.

1. That with reference to the following items, the amounts have been calculated pursuant to law and appropriated as such in the budget:
 - a. Payment of interest and debt redemption charges
 - b. Deferred charges and statutory expenditures
 - c. Cash deficit of preceding year
 - d. Reserve for uncollected taxes
 - e. Other reserves and non-disbursement items
 - f. Any inclusions of amounts required for school purposes.

2. That the provisions relating to limitation on increases of appropriations pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.2 and appropriations for exceptions to limits on appropriations found at N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.3 et seq., are fully met (complies with CAP law).

3. That the budget is in such form, arrangement, and content as required by the Local Budget Law and N.J.A.C. 5:30-4 and 5:30-5.

4. That pursuant to the Local Budget Law:
 - a. All estimates of revenue are reasonable, accurate and correctly stated,
 - b. Items of appropriation are properly set forth
 - c. In itemization, form, arrangement and content, the budget will permit the exercise of the comptroller function within the municipality.

5. The budget and associated amendments have been introduced and publicly advertised in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Local Budget Law, except that failure to meet the deadlines of N.J.S.A. 40A:4-5 shall not prevent such certification.

4. MOTIONS

Departmental Reports

Council member Biggs (*Communications*) – As previously reported, students from the Stevens Institute created an Android-based app for the Borough of Glen Rock. This app can be installed on any Android-based smart phone and pull up information on the Borough; this is available now. Secondly, Josh Stein, who is our Borough camera man, is also a graphic artist for the school newspaper which was recently awarded a site-excellence award. We were the only student newspaper in New Jersey to receive this award. Congratulations to all involved!

Council member Nogara (*Finance*) – We’re in the final stretch of preparation for the 2014 budget. Each line item is reviewed and scrutinized closely. Thank you to all involved in its preparation. Hopefully, the budget will be presented at the April 16th meeting. The GR Tree Trust and Shade Tree Committee will be giving free tree seedlings away at the Recycling Center. This will happen on Sunday March 30th, 1-4 p.m.

Council member Pazan (*Library*) – Friends of the Glen Rock Library will be holding their annual Book Sale, beginning tomorrow March 29th. A program on March 29th will be held about the Lenape Indians. There will be a Teen Murder Mystery on April 25th. The Library will deliver books to your home.

Council member Orseck (*Recreation*) – Matt Zilvetti, a resident Eagle Scout candidate, will be installing scoreboards at Wilde Park. GRBA will be installing two canopies over the player benches. The AED Committee has raised enough funds for 25 AED units; they are approximately \$1,300/each. Thirteen are on the field, twelve go with the traveling teams and they hope to raise the funds for twelve additional units so all travel teams will have them. The restrooms at Children’s Park will be renovated, expected to take approximately six weeks. GRBA registration is nearly completion with 700+ children signed up thus far. The baseball and softball parade will be this Saturday, March 29th at 9:00 a.m. kicking off the baseball season. Pool badges go on sale April 1st.

Council member Surrago (*Building*) – The Recycling Center will switch to Spring/Summer hours on April 1st. The Compost Center will also re-open at that time. Beginning May 1st DPW will no longer be able to accept plastic bags with recyclables. This is due to stricter recycling regulations with our recycling vendors. Only paper bags or barrels should be used, instead of plastic bags. The only time plastic bags can be used would be on your designated rubbish day or your household garbage. Recycling is searching for a vendor that will accept plastic bag; however, it is a very small market. The Recycling Center is trying to schedule a town-wide shredding day. The Environmental Commission is sponsoring a home energy audit. Information will be sent to individual homes.

**BOROUGH OF GLEN ROCK
ORDINANCE NO. 1697**

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 216 OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF GLEN ROCK - 1971 AS AMENDED ENTITLED "VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC" BEING AN ORDINANCE CONTROLLING VEHICLE AND TRAFFIC REGULATION WITHIN THE BOROUGH; TO AMEND PARKING RESTRICTIONS ALONG RADBURN ROAD.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council, the Borough of Glen Rock, County of Bergen, State of New Jersey, as follows:

Section I - Chapter 216 of the Revised General Ordinances of the Borough of Glen Rock 1971, as amended, being an Ordinance entitled "Vehicles and Traffic" is hereby amended as to the following subsection:

A. Section 216-29 entitled "Schedule I: Parking Time Prohibited at All Times" is hereby amended by adding thereto the following:

<u>Name of Street</u>	<u>Side</u>	<u>Location</u>
Radburn Road	East	From a point 150 feet from the northeast corner of Kirkwood Place.

Section II. VALIDITY-SEVERABILITY If the provisions of any section, subsection, paragraph, subdivision, or clause of this Ordinance shall be held invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall not affect or invalidate the remainder of this Ordinance but such judgment shall be confined in its operation to the section, paragraph, subdivision or clause directly involved in the controversy in which said judgment shall have been rendered.

Section III All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent with the provisions hereon.

Section IV This Ordinance shall take effect upon passage as required by law.

BOROUGH OF GLEN ROCK
ORDINANCE NO. 1698

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 150 OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF GLEN ROCK - 1971 AS AMENDED, ENTITLED “PARKING” BEING AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING REGULATIONS FOR PARKING WITHIN POSTED PROPERTY AND PUBLIC PARKING LOT(S) AND TO PROVIDE FOR VIOLATIONS THEREFOR.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council, the Borough of Glen Rock, County of Bergen, State of New Jersey, as follows:

Section I - Chapter 150, of the Revised General Ordinances of the Borough of Glen Rock 1971, as amended, entitled "**Parking**", is hereby amended by deleting Sections 150-2 entitled "**Parking on Posted Property Unlawful**", 150-3 entitled "**Parking on Park Land**" and 150-4 entitled "**Violations**" in their entirety to be replaced with the following:

“§ 150-2 Parking on Posted Property Unlawful.

A. Parking Prohibited. It shall be unlawful for any person to park or leave standing any vehicle on lands of another, whether publicly or privately owned, in the Borough, after notice has been posted by the owner, occupant, lessee or licensee prohibiting such parking. Nothing herein contained shall apply to any lands lying within the bounds of any public street or highway.

B. Signs. Suitable signs not less than 18 inches by 24 inches bearing the words “NO PARKING”, together with any qualifications or restrictions of such parking, if any,

and conspicuously displayed, shall be posted on the lands by the owner, occupant, lessee or license. Defacing, tampering with or damaging such signs when posted shall constitute a violation of this article.

§ 150-3 Parking on lots within Park Land.

A. Except as provided herein, the parking use and regulations of motor vehicles upon lands owned by the Borough and dedicated for park purposes shall be determined by Resolution of the Council.

B. Designated Lots. Parking of vehicles within the following parking lots lying within Borough park land is hereby controlled by the provisions of this chapter:

1. Wilde Memorial Park.
2. Swimming Pool.
3. Recycling Area (Faber Field).

C. Parking Within Spaces. No vehicle shall be parked or be allowed to stand except within the lines marked for such purpose therein.

D. Parking Prohibited Certain Hours.

- i) No vehicle shall be parked or allowed to remain in any public parking lot pursuant to § 216-7 entitled “Overnight Parking”.
- ii) Parking is limited to passenger cars. The Borough of Glen rock disclaims any responsibility for damage to vehicles or contents, including theft or vandalism.

E. Signs complying with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 39:1-1 et seq. shall be installed at the areas so designated.

F. Reserved Parking Spaces. Parking reserved for physically handicapped drivers.

1. The following locations are hereby designated as restricted parking spaces for use by persons who have been issued special vehicle identification cards by the Division of Motor Vehicles, pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A 39:4-205, when using a motor vehicle on which is displayed a certificate for which a special vehicle identification card has been issued, pursuant to N.J.S.A 39:4-206:

- a. Two (2), designated spaces within the Wild Memorial Park parking lot.
- b. Two (2), designated spaces within the Swimming Pool parking lot.
- c. Seven (7) designated spaces within the Recycling Center (Farber Field) parking lot.

2. All spaces indicated hereby shall be painted and signed in accordance with the applicable regulations issued from time to time by the State of New Jersey Department of Transportation.

G. It shall be unlawful for any person to drive or park upon any pedestrian walkway on lands owned by the Borough. Nothing herein will prohibit the operation or parking of emergency vehicles, public work or utility vehicles on any walkway during the performance of their duties.

150-4. Violations.

A. Maximum penalty

1. For violation of any provision of this Chapter, the maximum penalty shall, upon conviction of a violation, be any combination of the following:

- a. A fine not exceeding \$1,000.00, or a period of community service not exceeding ninety (90) days.
- b. Application. The maximum penalty is not intended to state an appropriate penalty for each and every violation. Any lesser penalty, including a nominal penalty, may be appropriate for a particular case or a particular violation.

B. Separate Violations. Each violation of any of the provisions of the Chapter and each day that each such violation shall continue shall be deemed to be a separate and distinct offense.”

Section III All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent with the provisions hereof are hereby repealed.

Section IV This Ordinance shall take effect upon passage as required by law.
