**BOROUGH OF GLEN ROCK
2013 ANNUAL AUDIT
CORRECTIVE ACTION PLAN**

WHEREAS, the Borough received the 2013 Audit from Gary Higgins, Lerch, Vinci and Higgins, LLP, on June 5, 2014, and presented below is the Corrective Action Plan response to the recommendations made by the auditor:

Recommendations:

1. All checks issued from both the General and Bail accounts contain two authorized check signatures.

Corrective Action Plan

The Administrative Office of The Courts financial procedures do not require 2 signatures on General and Bail account checks. General account checks currently contain 2 authorized signatures pursuant to last year's audit recommendation. In as much as the Glen Rock Court is staffed by 1 person during business hours, sureties are entitled to the prompt refund of bail and the requirement of 2 authorized signatures on Bail account checks would interfere with that process.

Implementation Date – Complete

2. A formalized accounting and reporting system be implemented for amounts collected by the various municipal departments to ensure that cash receipt journals are maintained to account for all funds received, and financial reports are prepared monthly and reconciled with the Finance Office and the composition of deposits per the swim pool records be in agreement with actual deposits.

Corrective Action Plan

The Borough is creating a standardized cash receipts reporting system to be utilized by each department to ensure that reconciliation on a monthly basis with the Finance Office. For 2014, an update has been made to the software program for swim pool badge sales to accurately reflect the composition of each deposit.

Implementation Date – Currently in Process, by end of 3rd quarter.

3. The encumbrance accounting system be utilized to ensure that materials and/or services be ordered only after a purchase order has been executed.

Corrective Action: Because of staffing issues the Borough continues to rely on each department for the majority of their purchases. The Borough Administrator/CFO will continue to discuss and review the encumbrance accounting system procedure with Borough Department Heads. In review of our current purchasing system, and because the Borough does not have a purchasing agent on staff, the Borough will continue to use the following steps to comply with the encumbrance accounting procedure set by Technical Accounting Directive:

- a. Prepare and encumber a blanket purchase order for those vendors that are frequently used by department, making the departments aware on a quarterly basis the status of such purchase orders
- b. Obtaining a proposal or quote from vendors prior to purchase and delivery of goods or services and requesting a purchase order for such proposal or quote
- c. Continue to work with our software vendor to refine the requisition feature in our financial program, to allow departments to produce a requisition from their respective offices, that can be forwarded to the finance department and ultimately encumbered into a purchase order

THE UNDERTAKING OF A CONTINUING DISCLOSURE REVIEW
AND AUTHORIZING PARTICIPATION IN THE MUNICIPALITIES
CONTINUING DISCLOSURE COOPERATION INITIATIVE OF
THE DIVISION OF ENFORCEMENT OF THE U.S. SECURITIES
AND EXCHANGE COMMISSION**

WHEREAS, the Borough of Glen Rock (the "Governmental Entity") has entered into continuing disclosure agreement(s) in connection with certain of its prior bond and/or note issuance(s) (the "Prior Issuances"), agreeing to file certain financial information and operating data and/or certain enumerated event notices with the former nationally recognized municipal securities information repositories or the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board (the "MSRB")

pursuant to the provisions of Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, as amended (the “Rule”); and

WHEREAS, the Governmental Entity has made certain representations regarding its continuing disclosures in bond and/or note offering documents in connection with its Prior Issuances; and

WHEREAS, in response to widespread concerns that many municipal issuers have not been complying with their obligations to file continuing disclosure documents under the Rule, and furthermore have made false representations concerning compliance in bond and note offering documents, the Division of Enforcement (the “Division”) of the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission (the “Commission”) has set forth its Municipalities Continuing Disclosure Cooperation Initiative (the “MCDC Initiative”), attached hereto as Exhibit A, whereby the Commission will recommend favorable settlement terms to municipal issuers involved in the offer or sale of municipal securities, as well as underwriters of such offerings, if they self-report to the Division, by 12:00 a.m. on September 10, 2014, possible violations involving materially inaccurate statements in bond and note offering documents relating to prior compliance with continuing disclosure obligations pursuant to the Rule; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Local Finance Notice 2014-9, attached hereto as Exhibit B, the Director of the Local Finance Board, Division of Local Government Services of the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey, has recommended the undertaking of a Review (as hereinafter defined) by all municipal issuers and participation in the MCDC Initiative, where appropriate, as determined by the facts of each Review (the “LFB Recommendation”);

NOW, THEREFORE, IN CONNECTION WITH THE LFB RECOMMENDATION, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNMENTAL ENTITY, as follows:

Section 1. The Governmental Entity, through its Chief Financial Officer or a third-party disclosure-dissemination agent, is hereby directed to conduct a continuing disclosure review of its prior continuing disclosure undertakings (the “Review”), and the Governmental Entity hereby ratifies any such previously conducted Review. Such Review shall include, but is not limited to, a historical review of the Governmental Entity’s continuing disclosure obligations and filings in connection with its Prior Issuances that are presently outstanding and which are no longer outstanding but, as of the date five years prior to the date of submission of the Questionnaire (as hereinafter defined), were outstanding; and the undertaking, at any time, of any applicable remedial filings with the MSRB deemed necessary for compliance with its continuing disclosure obligations.

Section 2. The Governmental Entity, through its Chief Financial Officer, is hereby authorized to participate in the MCDC Initiative, if in the discretion of the Chief Financial Officer after consultation with Governmental Entity officials, it is determined that the Governmental Entity may have made materially inaccurate statements in its bond and/or note offering documents relating to prior compliance with continuing disclosure obligations pursuant

to the Rule in connection with its Prior Issuances issued during the period beginning five years prior to the date of submission of the Questionnaire.

Section 3. The Chief Financial Officer of the Governmental Entity is hereby authorized to execute and deliver any and all documents and instruments, including the Municipalities Continuing Disclosure Cooperation Initiative Questionnaire for Self-Reporting Entities contained in the MCDC Initiative (the “Questionnaire”), and to do and cause to be done any and all acts and things necessary or proper for participating in the MCDC Initiative and all related transactions, including the Review, contemplated by this resolution.

Section 4. All resolutions or proceedings, or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this resolution are to the extent of such conflict hereby repealed.

Section 5. This resolution shall become effective in accordance with applicable law.

Ordinance Procedure # 1703 (Rodney Street Parking)

Date of Introduction: July 30, 2014
