RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF GLEN ROCK, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, NEW JERSEY, COVENANTING TO COMPLY WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THE INTERNAL REVENUE CODE OF 1986, AS AMENDED, APPLICABLE TO THE EXCLUSION FROM GROSS INCOME FOR FEDERAL INCOME TAX PURPOSES OF INTEREST ON OBLIGATIONS ISSUED BY THE BOROUGH OF GLEN ROCK AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, DEPUTY BOROUGH CLERK, CHIEF FINANCIAL OFFICER AND OTHER BOROUGH OFFICIALS TO TAKE SUCH ACTION AS THEY MAY DEEM NECESSARY OR ADVISABLE TO EFFECT SUCH COMPLIANCE AND DESIGNATING AN \$8,470,000 BOND ANTICIPATION NOTE, DATED JANUARY 21, 2011 AND PAYABLE JANUARY 20, 2012, AS A “QUALIFIED TAX-EXEMPT OBLIGATION” PURSUANT TO SECTION 265(b)(3) OF THE INTERNAL REVENUE CODE OF 1986, AS AMENDED

WHEREAS, the Borough of Glen Rock, in the County of Bergen, New Jersey (the “Borough”) from time to time issues bonds, notes and other obligations, the interest on which is excluded from gross income for Federal income tax purposes, and desires to take such action as may be necessary or advisable to establish and maintain such exclusion; and

WHEREAS, the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the “Code”), contains provisions with respect to the exclusion from gross income for Federal income tax purposes of interest on obligations, including provisions, among others, which require issuers of tax-exempt obligations, such as the Borough to account for and rebate certain arbitrage earnings to the United States Treasury and to take other action to establish and maintain such Federal tax exclusion; and

WHEREAS, the Borough intends to issue an \$8,470,000 bond anticipation note, dated January 21, 2011 and payable January 20, 2012 (the “Note”); and

WHEREAS, the Borough desires to designate the Note as a “qualified tax-exempt obligation” pursuant to Section 265(b)(3) of the Code;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Glen Rock, in the County of Bergen, New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION 1. The Borough Council of the Borough of Glen Rock hereby covenants on behalf of the Borough, to the extent permitted by the Constitution and the laws of the State of New Jersey, to do and perform all acts and things permitted by law and necessary to assure that interest paid on bonds, notes or other obligations of the Borough (including the Note) be and remain excluded from gross income of the owners thereof for Federal income tax purposes pursuant to Section 103 of the Code.

SECTION 2. The Mayor, Deputy Borough Clerk, Chief Financial Officer and the other officials of the Borough are hereby authorized and directed to take such action, make such representations and give such assurances as they may deem necessary or advisable to effect compliance with the Code.

SECTION 3. The Note is hereby designated as a “qualified tax-exempt obligation” for the purpose of Section 265(b)(3) of the Code.

SECTION 4. It is hereby determined and stated that (1) said Note is not a “private activity bond” as defined in the Code and (2) the Borough and its subordinate entities, if any, do not reasonably anticipate issuing in excess of \$10 million of new money tax-exempt obligations (other than private activity bonds) during the calendar year 2011.

SECTION 5. It is further determined and stated that the Borough has not, as of the date hereof, issued any tax-exempt obligations (other than the Note) during the calendar year 2011.

SECTION 6. The Borough will, to the best of its ability, attempt to comply with respect to the limitations on issuance of tax-exempt obligations pursuant to Section 265(b)(3) of the Code; however, said Borough does not covenant to do so, and hereby expressly states that a covenant is not made hereby.

SECTION 7. The issuing officers of the Borough are hereby authorized to deliver a certified copy of this resolution to the original purchaser of the Note and to further provide such original purchaser with a certificate of obligations issued during the calendar year 2011 dated as of the date of delivery of the Note.

SECTION 8. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.

Departmental Reports

Council member Nogara (*Licenses & Franchises*) – No report on licenses; however, Council member is looking forward to acting as liaison to the Shade Tree Commission.

Council member Pazan (*Finance*) – The Finance Committee this past week with presentations by the GR Ambulance Corps. as well as GRTV. Council member Pazan commented that the Borough has set goals in developing the budget among which are paying down outstanding debt, reduce spending and consolidation of services and equipment.

Council member Orseck (*Recreation*) - Baseball registration began last Saturday. The kick-off Gala for the Turf Field fund raising effort is Friday, April 1st. Invitations will be sent to all parents with children in the recreational programs by February 15th.

Council member O’Hagan (*Safety*) – Council member thanked DPW for their tremendous job in getting rid of the snow, which allows our emergency vehicles to get to emergencies easily. The installation dinners of the Fire Department and Ambulance Corps. have occurred with new officers being sworn in. Again, Council member O’Hagan urged residents to slow down.

Council member Biggs (*Buildings & Grounds*) – Building Department had a busy year last year with the trend continuing in the New Year. Council member Biggs commented the Building Department is working very closely with Good Shepherd church and their structural issues. Council member Biggs also reminded residents that even though it seems the Building Department has many rules and regulations it is solely an attempt to keep residents safe and adhere to State

mandated codes. Discussions continue with GRTV, OEM, The Gazette and our website coordinator in an attempt to improve basic communications with the public. Feedback from borough organizations is also welcome. Additionally, artwork for the municipal building is back on track with historical pictures to appear shortly.

Council member Surrago (*Public Works*) – The Recycling Center hours has changed as well as the schedule for cardboard and corrugated. When cardboard and corrugated is collected separately the Borough receives additional money when it is not co-mingled with other recyclables. Residents are reminded to tie or paper bag their newspapers so they are not blown around prior to pick-up. Council member Surrago read an e-mail from a resident thanking DPW for their success in clearing main and side roads in comparison to neighboring towns.

SECTION 2. All salaries herein above listed are to be considered as annual salaries unless otherwise designated.

SECTION 3. The Annual Salaries, weekly wages, and hourly wages shall be paid in bi-weekly installments, except that the Mayor and Council, Secretary of the Board of Health may be compensated quarterly.

SECTION 4. The amount to be paid to each officer or employee within the salary and wage range shall be fixed from time to time by resolution of the Mayor and Council.

In addition to the salary ranges indicated above, longevity pay will be given to full-time Public Works personnel, Sanitation personnel, and Administrative personnel hired before 1-1-77 and Police Officers at the rate of two (2%) per cent for each four years of service not to exceed twelve (12%) per cent or the amount set forth in the contract. Longevity credit will be computed and paid semi-annually each year (January 1 and July 1) and semi-annually thereafter. Employees who serve in more than one capacity and spend their full time in Borough Service shall be considered a full-time employee for the purpose of longevity.

SECTION 6. The Mayor and Council may allow a onetime payment of \$500 - \$1,000 for employees who have attended classes and have earned a certification appropriate to their position or department.

SECTION 7. The provisions of any ordinance or ordinances inconsistent with the provisions hereof are hereby expressly repealed.

SECTION 8. Where labor contract prevails, terms and conditions of the contract shall supersede this ordinance.

- b. Intermediate: 1.5 per classroom, but not less than 1.5 per teacher and staff.

c. Secondary:2.5 per classroom, but not less than 1.5 per teacher and staff.

d. Adult educational and vocational: one per staff, plus one per 1.5 students.

e. Instructional Schools: 1 space for every 250 square feet of space.”

executive, or administrative purposes. Retail sales shall be permitted within this zone district, provided that the merchandise sold is manufactured by the occupant of the building wherein such retail sales are conducted.”

BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council, the Borough of Glen Rock, County of

Bergen, State of New Jersey, as follows:

Section I - Chapter 4 of the Revised General Ordinances of the Borough of Glen Rock 1971, as amended, being an Ordinance entitled "Administration of Government" is hereby amended as to the following section(s):

A. Section 4-25 entitled "Borough Prosecutor" shall be deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

"4-25. Borough Prosecutor.

A. Position Established.

i. Prosecutor.

ii. Assistant Borough Prosecutor. The Governing Body may appoint an Assistant Borough Prosecutor to assist in the Administration of justice in a timely and effective manner within the Borough's Municipal Court.

B. Qualifications. The Borough Prosecutor and Assistant Borough Prosecutor shall be an attorney at law of New Jersey in good standing.

C. Appointment. The Mayor shall nominate, and with the advice and consent of the Council, appoint a Borough Prosecutor and an Assistant Borough Prosecutor, including the filling of a vacancy in the office which shall be for the unexpired term only.

D. Term. The term of office of the Borough Prosecutor and Assistant Borough Prosecutor shall be for one (1) year, commencing on January 1 and terminating on December 31 of the same year or until a successor shall have been appointed and qualified.

E. Duties. Pursuant to the provision of N.J.S.A. 2B:25-5, as may be amended or supplemented, the Borough Prosecutor and Assistant Borough Prosecutor shall prosecute cases to be tried before the Borough Court alleging a violation of the criminal laws of the State of New Jersey, the ordinances of the Borough, the Motor Vehicle Statutes of the State of New Jersey and such other cases as may be designated by the Council. The Borough Prosecutor and Assistant Borough Prosecutor shall also appear before the Council upon its request to prosecute any matters which may be within its jurisdiction.

F. Salary. The salary of the Borough Prosecutor and Assistant Borough Prosecutor shall be in such amount as the Council shall determine by resolution or ordinance.

Section II.
