WHEREAS, the recycling regulations impose on municipalities certain requirements as a condition for applying for tonnage grants, including but not limited to, making and keeping accurate, verifiable records of materials collected and claimed by the municipality; and

WHEREAS, A resolution authorizing this municipality to apply for such tonnage grants for calendar year 2011 will memorialize the commitment of this municipality to recycling and to indicate the assent of the Borough Council of Glen Rock to the efforts undertaken by the municipality and the requirements contained in the Recycling Act and recycling regulations; and

SECTION 2. All salaries herein above listed are to be considered as annual salaries unless otherwise designated.

SECTION 3. The Annual Salaries, weekly wages, and hourly wages shall be paid in bi-weekly installments, except that the Mayor and Council, Secretary of the Board of Health may be compensated quarterly.

SECTION 4. The amount to be paid to each officer or employee within the salary and wage range shall be fixed from time to time by resolution of the Mayor and Council.

SECTION 5. In addition to the salary ranges indicated above, longevity pay will be given to full-time Public Works personnel, Sanitation personnel, and Administrative personnel hired before 1-1-77 and Police Officers at the rate of two (2%) per cent for each four years of service not to exceed twelve (12%) per cent or the amount set forth in the contract. Longevity credit will be computed and paid semi-annually each year (January 1 and July 1) and semi-annually thereafter. Employees who serve in more than one capacity and spend their full time in Borough Service shall be considered a full-time employee for the purpose of longevity.

SECTION 6. The Mayor and Council may allow a onetime payment of \$500 - \$1,000 for employees who have attended classes and have earned a certification appropriate to their position or department.

SECTION 7. The provisions of any ordinance or ordinances inconsistent with the provisions hereof are hereby expressly repealed.

SECTION 8. Where labor contract prevails, terms and conditions of the contract shall supersede this ordinance.

SECTION 9. This ordinance shall take effect January 1, 2010 upon passage and publication as required by law.

5. MEETING OPEN TO THE PUBLIC: (Before speaking at the meeting, each person must state their name and address. 5 minute limit)

Anthony Pucci – 150 Lowell Road – Mr. Pucci asked for an update of proposed renovations to Faber Field. Mayor van Keuren stated there are no plans for Fisher Field. The artificial turf plans are for lower Faber Field. A committee has been established and has spoken to the Council in detail. The lighting that is proposed is less intrusive than what currently exists. It is the Mayor’s understanding that the lighting would not affect the surrounding neighbors on Dunham or Doremus. The lights will most definitely be less intrusive than currently. Mr. Pucci stated he does not believe many of his neighbors are even aware of the proposed plans. Council also noted there is a website with frequently asked questions; www.glenrockturf.org . Mr. Pucci asked what sports will be played on the field. Council member O’Hagan replied it will be used for multi-sports; football, baseball, lacrosse and soccer recreational sports. The funds are being privately raised.

Council member O’Hagan publically thanked the Fire Department for going out and digging out fire hydrants. Many residents have helped by shoveling out their hydrant; however many more still need to be cleared.

Condolences were extended to the family of Tom Egan, who recently lost his battle with cancer.
