WHEREAS, on July 1, 1984 the Borough of Glen Rock undertook the planning and development of a senior citizen housing complex pursuant to a Standing Assistance Agreement between the Borough and Glen Rock Senior Citizen Housing Corporation (the “Redeveloper”) as amended and supplemented (the “Agreement”); and

WHEREAS, based on the Agreement, a Senior Housing Facility (“Glen Courts”) was developed within the Glen Avenue Redevelopment Area, Since the completion of Glen Courts, it has proven to be a great success to the Borough and its senior citizens; and

WHEREAS, based on numerous public meetings, surveys and the overall success of Glen Courts, there is a significant need for additional senior citizen housing within Glen Rock; and

WHEREAS, there is a need to evaluate alternative sites available for senior housing, and to assess the economic viability of a new development, to be presented for ultimate consideration by the Glen Rock citizens and the Borough Council.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council, the Borough of Glen Rock, County of Bergen, State of New Jersey, as follows:

Section I - Chapter 40 of the Revised General Ordinances of the Borough of Glen Rock 1971 as amended being an Ordinance entitled "Police Department" is hereby amended as to the following subsections:

1. Subsection 40-13 entitled "Fees for Administrative Services" is hereby amended by deleting subsection "C" in its entirety to be replaced with the following:

"C. Copying Police Analog Audio or Videotape - Any individual requesting a duplicate copy of a Police Analog Audio or Videotape for purposes of discovery for court proceedings shall pay a fee as provided in Chapter 101, Fees. In addition to the fees, the individual shall provide to the Police Department a new sealed blank audio or videotape and a self-addressed stamped envelope."

2. Subsection 40-13 entitled "Fees for Administrative Services" is hereby amended by adding thereto a new subsection "D" to read as follows:

"D. Copying of police digital media contained on any electronic data storage devices including, but not limited to hardware, diskettes, backup tapes, CD-ROMS, DVD, Flash memory devices, USB Thumb Drives, and other storage mediums. Any individual requesting a duplicate copy of police digital media for purposes of discovery for court proceedings shall pay a fee as provided in Chapter <http://www.ecode360.com/10098876>101, Fees. In addition to the fees, the individual shall provide to the Police Department a new sealed blank CD-ROM, DVD, Flash memory device or USB Thumb Drive and a self-addressed stamped envelope."

Section II. VALIDITY-SEVERABILITY If the provisions of any section, subsection, paragraph, subdivision, or clause of this Ordinance shall be held invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall not affect or invalidate the remainder of this Ordinance but such judgment shall be confined in its operation to the section, paragraph, subdivision or clause directly involved in the controversy in which said judgment shall have been rendered.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council, the Borough of Glen Rock, County of Bergen, State of New Jersey, as follows:

Section I - Chapter 101 of the Revised General Ordinances of the Borough of Glen Rock 1971 as amended being an Ordinance entitled "Fees" is hereby amended as to the following subsections:

1. Section 101-18 entitled "Police Administrative Fees" is hereby amended by deleting subsection "B" to replaced with the following"

"B. Analog Audio or Videotape duplicate for the purposes of discovery for court proceedings: \$35.00 per tape."

2. Section 101-18 entitled "Police Administrative Fees" is hereby amended by adding thereto a new subsection "D" to read as follows:

Borough Administrator Benjamin noted that NJ Transit will be conducting emergency track repairs on the Main Line track from August 10th through the 24th. The tracks will be closed to all vehicle traffic during this time. The Police are in the process of developing a detour plan. NJ Transit will be working on weekends from 5 a.m. – 7 p.m. and weekdays from 9 a.m. – 3 p.m.
