

Below is a list of local and national organizations that accept all kinds of things – from books to building supplies, from cars to clothing. Please note that this list was compiled in August 2017—we suggest that you call each organization before going out of your way to drop off items, just in case needs have changed!

This initiative is part of a Girl Scout Silver Award project for two Glen Rock high school students who want to help you help others.

GENERAL HOUSEHOLD DONATIONS

The following 3 organizations accept a wide range of items, from all types of clothing to furniture to household appliances. See below for more details.

Donate BBBS (Big Brothers Big Sisters)

This group collects gently-used clothing, housewares, books, toys, furniture, and appliances. The revenue goes directly to its local Big Brothers Big Sisters agencies.

To donate, call to schedule free pick up: 877-336-8828. You can also drop off items at the Denville BBBS Donation Center, 307 Route 46 East, Denville (about 30 minutes away). Hours are Mon-Fri 8 am to 4:30 om, Sat and Sun 10 am to 3 pm. Additionally, you can bring small items to a drop-off bin: 96 Schyler Avenue, North Arlington (30 minutes from Glen Rock).

Goodwill

When you donate your new and gently used items, Goodwill sells them in their stores or on their online auction site and uses the revenues to fund employment training and job placement services for people in our community.

To donate, drop off items at the Goodwill store, 809 NJ-17, Paramus (on 17 South, just north of Campmor). Donations are accepted Monday through Saturday at the store, 9 am to 9 pm. Closed on Sunday. Phone: 201-444-0596.

Vietnam Veterans of America (VVA)

NON-PERISHABLE FOOD

St. Paul's Food Pantry

This Paterson, NJ food pantry provides supplemental food assistance to individuals and families who are unable to financially meet their daily nutritional requirements. In 2016, the SPCDC Food Pantry provided services to 2,289 Heads of Households, a total of 5741 beneficiaries (i.e. adults & K-12). This level of support equated to 323,475 meals distributed.

Accepts all non-perishable food items. To donate, drop off anytime Monday through Friday from 9 am to 3 pm. at 451 Van Houten St, downstairs inside the church. If there is a large donation, St. Paul's is happy to pick it up.
