The Borough of Glen Rock is already ensuring that all new residential development and redevelopment projects that are subject to the Residential Site Improvement Standards for Stormwater management (including the NJDEP Stormwater Management rules. N.J.A.C. 7:8,) are in compliance with those standards. The Borough Planning and Zoning boards ensure such compliance before issuing preliminary or final subdivision or site plan approvals under the Municipal Land Use Law.

Since the EDPA, the Borough of Glen Rock has not constructed any new development or redevelopment projects on the Borough property. If the Borough decides to construct such a project before the municipal stormwater control ordinance takes effect, adequate long-term operation and maintenance of BMP's for that project will be ensured by requiring a project maintenance plan similar to the maintance plan described in the draft of that ordinance. Any storm drain inlets installed will also be required to comply with the design standard in Attachment C of the Borough's General Stormwater Permit., the Borough of Glen Rock will ensure such operation and maintenance by complying with the maintenance requirements of the ordinance. In addition, any storm drain inlets installed for such projects will comply with that ordinance's standards for such inlets.

The municipal engineer has submitted the final revision (based on comments received by the County) of the municipal stormwater management plan and municipal stormwater control ordinance to the County for approval dated April, 2006.

The ordinance, which will be administered by the Borough of Glen Rock Construction Official, will control stormwater from non-residential development and redevelopment projects. Where it is necessary to implement the stormwater management plan, the approved ordinance will also control aspects of residential development projects that are not subject to the Residential Site Standards.

The Borough of Glen Rock will also enforce, through the municipal stormwater control compliance with the design standard in Attachment C of the permit to control passage of solid and floatable materials through storm drain inlets. The Borough of Glen Rock expects that for most projects such compliance will be achieved by installation of the NJDOT bicycle safe grate and, if needed, a curb opening with a clear space no bigger than two (2) inches across the smallest diameter.

As mandated by the Municipal Stormwater Regulation Program (N.J.A.C. 7:14A) Clean Water legislation, the Borough of Glen Rock will be strictly enforcing the Borough Pet Waste Ordinance (74-8 sec. G. & H).

Under the ordinance, pet owners are required to immediately and properly dispose of their pet's solid waste deposited on any property, public or private, not owned or possessed by that individual. Proper disposal includes placing waste in a designated receptacle, such as a garbage can which is regularly emptied, or flushing it down the toilet.

Penalties: Upon conviction:

- A penalty fine not to exceed \$1,000
- Imprisonment for a term not exceeding 90 days or
- Community service not exceeding 90 days
- Each day that a particular violation continues shall constitute a separate offense

The Borough also encourages all pet owners to pick up solid waste deposited on their own properties, since this also fouls our waterways.

Pet waste, which enters the storm drains, goes *directly and untreated* into the Diamond and Hohokus Brooks. This fecal matter increases the bacteria levels in the streams, which in turn depletes the oxygen necessary to sustain aquatic life and a healthy environment.


The Borough of Glen Rock has coordinated with the Girl Scouts, Troop 265, when implementing the storm drain labeling program. All storm drain inlets that are along municipal streets with sidewalks, and all storm drain inlets within plazas, parking areas or maintenance yards that are operated by the Borough of Glen Rock were labeled using plastic labels Obtained from DAS manufacturing The curb marker is adhered to the curb using a specially formulated "curb marker adhesive.

The attached Borough Tax Map shows the locations of all the storm drain inlets identified and labeled. This initial labeling and identification project was completed by the Girl Scouts under the direction of Margot Spille in the month of October 2004.

During the annual catch basin cleaning program, the Borough will be checking these labels to ensure that they are still visible. Labels that are not visible or missing will be reported and replaced as soon as possible

As of this date the Borough is considering switching to a 4" Storm Drain Marker manufactured by Almetek. The reason for this change is the result of some of the das markers clear plastic finish deteriating due to ultraviolet exposure. Markers will also be placed on the top backplate for greater visibility...

All Markers were replaced during the month of May, 2008 with the marker shown below:

The Borough of Glen Rock DPW and Mr. Robert Dill, a member of our environmental Commission, will conduct physical inspection of all our outfall pipes during the mapping process. We will use the DEP Illicit Connection Inspection Report Form to conduct the inspections, and each of these forms will be kept with our SPPP records. Outfall pipes that are found to have a dry weather flow or evidence of an intermittent non-stormwater flow will be rechecked again to locate the illicit connection. If we are able to locate the illicit connection and the connection is within Glen Rock, we will cite the responsible party for being in violation of our illicit connection ordinance, and we will have the connection eliminated immediately. If after the appropriate amount of investigation, we are unable to locate the source of the illicit connection, we will submit the Closeout Investigation Form with our Annual Inspection and Recertification. If an illicit connection is found to originate from another public entity, The Borough of Glen Rock will report the illicit connection to the Responsible Party.
